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Why This Election Matters

Dear Principals, Teachers, Parents, and School Communities,

This federal election will be a critical moment for Independent schools, teachers and students, and the families who choose them.

There are growing calls from politicians and commentators who advocate that funding for non-government schools should be reduced or even removed, and decisions made in the coming months will shape the future of education funding, family choice, and the opportunities available to the 716,000 students whose families choose an Independent school.

Independent school parents, like many in the wider community, may not be aware that every Australian student, no matter which school they attend, receives some funding from government. For Independent school students, that contribution is reduced based on the actual income – the Capacity to Contribute - of a school's parent body.

Families, who are also taxpayers, contribute the difference through fees, often making real sacrifices to send their children to their chosen school. Changes to government funding policies risk higher fees, reduced support for vulnerable students and fewer choices for families.

Protecting fair funding benefits every child and ensures a brighter future for all students, and the whole education sector.

To ensure our voices are heard, Independent Schools Australia (ISA), and the state and territory Associations of Independent Schools, have launched the **School Choice Counts campaign**. This initiative will support students, parents, and school communities coming together to protect fair funding and secure the right of every family to choose the best education for their children.

The **School Choice Counts Toolkit** has been designed as a resource for principals, teachers, and parents — equipping you with the tools to spread the word, engage with your school community, and advocate for what matters most: our students.

Here's what's in the toolkit and how you can use it:

KEY PRIORITIES FOR SCHOOL CHOICE COUNTS

1. Protecting Family Choice

Independent schools empower families to choose an education that aligns with their values, beliefs and child's needs. Many families make significant sacrifices to make this choice – particularly as cost-of-living pressures grow.

To keep this choice accessible:

- We call for **stable, predictable federal funding** that keeps school fees affordable.
- We urge all parties to rule out funding cuts that could limit family choice.

2. Ending the Blame Game

We believe every Australian child deserves access to a high-quality education that meets their unique needs and supports their future success – regardless of the school they choose or the sector it's in.

We should be united in this goal, but too often politics pits school sectors against each other.

To help focus on students and families to end this division, we need:

- A commitment to **cross-sector collaboration** to address shared challenges.
- A national campaign to promote understanding of how Australia's education system works and the critical role of all school sectors.

3. Supporting Vulnerable Students

Independent schools educate over 157,000 students with a disability, 19,000 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students and thousands of disadvantaged young Australians.

To ensure these students thrive:

- We advocate for fair and **adequate funding** for schools serving vulnerable communities.
- We need to ensure there's a 'safety net' to ensure our most disadvantaged students, and the schools that support them, receive the resources they need.

4. Investing in Cross-Sector Innovation

Innovation in education benefits every student. To encourage sharing of new approaches that can deliver great student outcomes, support wellbeing and address our teacher workforce challenges we propose:

- A **\$50 million cross-sector innovation** fund to share and scale solutions to our current and future challenges.
- Support for collaboration between Independent, government, and Catholic schools.

5. Building Choice into the Future

Demand for Independent schools is growing, with enrolments projected to rise by over 120,000 students in the next decade. Currently families and school communities contribute 90% of all capital funding. Government funding for the entire non-government sector is less than \$250 million annually compared to \$1.5 billion for government schools in NSW alone.

To help meet this future demand we need:

- Increased funding for the **Capital Grants Program** to help schools expand their capacity.
- Adjusted regional loadings that will support schools in rural and remote areas.

HOW GOVERNMENT FUNDING WORKS

Independent schools play a vital role in Australia's diverse education landscape, providing families with meaningful choices that align with their values and aspirations. Here's how government funding supports students across all school sectors, and where families step in to bridge the gap.

Step 1

Establishing Base Funding – The Schooling Resource Standard (SRS)

The Australian Government sets a standard funding amount per student to cover the basic cost of education. This base rate is the foundation of all school funding.

\$13,557* per primary student

\$17,036* per secondary student.

*funding is indexed each year to reflect inflation and rising education costs.

Step 2

Loadings for Educational Disadvantage

Extra funding is allocated to support students with greater needs. These loadings account for:

- School size
- Socio-educational disadvantage
- English language proficiency
- Disability
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander background
- Regional, remote or small school status

Step 3

Capacity to Contribute (CTC) – Adjusting for Family Income

Independent school funding is reduced based on the average family income. That means schools in wealthier areas get less. Public schools receive full funding regardless of family income.

Step 4

Bridging the Gap – Family Contributions

Any shortfall in government funding must be covered by families through school fees, fundraising and donations.







Write to Your MP A Step-by-Step Guide

Making your voice heard is simple! Follow these steps to identify your local Member of Parliament (MP) or election candidate, personalise the letter template and let your voice be heard!



STEP 1

Find Your MP

1. Visit the **Electorate Search Tool** on the ISA website to locate your electorate and MP.
2. Search for their contact details – including their electorate office and email address – using your preferred search engine and note it down.



STEP 2

Personalise the Template Letter

1. Download the Parent Letter or Stronger-Worded Parent Letter template for MPs from the [resources](#) page.
2. Fill in your personal details at the top of the letter (name, address, date, etc.).
3. Replace placeholders (e.g., “[MP/Candidate’s Name]” and “[School Name]”) with the appropriate information.
4. If desired, add a personal story or reason why school choice and funding are important to you and your family.



STEP 3

Send Your Letter

Email:

1. Copy and paste your customised letter into the body of an email or attach it as a document.
2. Send the email to your MP’s official address (noted down in Step 1).

3. Print your letter and mail it to your MP’s electorate office. Make sure to include your return address on the letter to receive a reply.



STEP 4

Share Your Efforts

1. Let your school community know you’ve contacted your MP to inspire others to take action.
2. Share your experience with the school office or campaign organisers to help track the impact of the **School Choice Counts** campaign.
